continue to use their Learning Journey Books). Online Learning Journals will mean that you can access information on your child's progress any time you want, on your phone, ipad, tablet etc. as long as you have an internet connection. If you don't have an internet connection at home you will be able to view your child's profile from within the school by using our computer(s) and devices or, as a last resort we can print it off for you. Learning Journals will enable your child's Teacher to make observations of learning in a fraction of the time it would have taken previously. This means they are going to have more time to teach and care for the children instead of filling out paperwork. It's also extremely environmentally friendly! Learning Journals allow you and your child to share achievements from out of school too! We will be sending out log-in details and further information during the next few weeks. You will then be able to read details of the key areas of progress and next steps in your child's learning. From August, the Learning Journals will be updated on a termly basis rather than all at the end of the year, giving you regular 'real time' information on progress and next steps.

HEADLICE Infection with head lice is a very common problem in the UK, especially among school children. Lice pass from one person to another during direct head-to-head contact. This is because lice cannot jump, fly or hop; they can only transfer to another head by walking along strands of hair. The best way to search for head lice is to use a specially designed bug busting comb available from a pharmacy. This is a fine-toothed plastic comb with spacing of less than 0.3mm. You can check for lice on dry or wet hair. Use a brush or an ordinary comb to first detangle hair. Once hair has been detangled, switch to the bug busting comb. Start at the middle of the front of the scalp. Comb the hair from the roots to the very end of the hair. After each stroke, examine the teeth of the comb for living lice. Rinse the comb if you find any lice. Continue combing section by section until you've done the whole head of hair. Make sure you cover every inch of the scalp, including the area just behind the ears and at the nape of the neck. For wet combing, simply wash hair and apply conditioner before starting these steps. Afterwards, rinse out the conditioner and check hair again with the nit comb before drying. If you find head lice, check every other member of the family, including any adults who have close contact with the child.

The Peebles Maths Circle is organised by the Maths Teachers at the high school and is a free drop-in session where children aged 5 to 16 and their families can join in with exciting mathematical activities, games and puzzles.
