**BREAKFAST CLUB** Breakfast Club runs every day, Monday-Friday in the School Assembly Hall from 7.50-8.40am (no entry before 7.50am or after 8.30am). This is for pupils in P.1-7 and is supervised by Mrs E. Hardie and Mrs E. Robertson. The cost is £1.00 per person, per day and there is no booking system – just turn up. Toast with spreads or cereal is available plus a drink of fruit juice, milk, hot chocolate or water. Other items are introduced from time to time, for example fruit and yoghurts. If your child has an allergy to any foods, please discuss this with Mrs Hardie. It should be noted that, although various board games and activities are provided, this is not an alternative to childcare. Whilst there is supervision, children will be expected to be well behaved, follow school rules, sit at the table and clear away their own cups and plates. P.2-7 children can leave Breakfast Club and go to the playground from 8.30am. P.1 children go direct to class from Breakfast Club.

**CYCLING TO SCHOOL** Please see the attached letter and information regarding children who cycle to school. In order to safeguard children, we ask that pupils and parents, who will be cycling to school read, understand and sign the Safe Cycling Contract. Thank you.

## ST. RONAN'S SCHOOL PROCEDURES

Following is a summary of our school policies and procedures for your information at the start of the new session. Full details can be found in our School Handbook which is available on the school website or ask for a copy at the office.

### School Uniform

The wearing of school uniform is actively encouraged at St. Ronan's.

The School colours are black and gold (tie & badge) and grey (tops). All pupils are asked to wear:

- **Grey** skirt/pinafore/trousers
- **White** shirt/blouse/polo shirt
- **Grey** cardigan/pullover/sweatshirt with the embroidered school badge)
- **Black shoes or trainers** to school and have a pair of **black plimsolls or trainers** to change into indoors
- In the summer months girls may wear a blue/white gingham pinafore

**Whilst we realise that other grey garments are available, we strongly recommend that children wear the official badged school sweatshirt or cardigan.** All garments can be ordered from the office or online at:

Please ensure children are sent to school with a suitable outdoor jacket - no matter what the weather is like when they leave home!

### **ALL ITEMS OF CLOTHING SHOULD BEAR THE CHILD'S FULL NAME & CLASS**

The wearing of inappropriate items of clothing, e.g. fashion items, jeans, football shirts, hoodies and unsuitable footwear is not allowed. For safety reasons, pupils should not wear high heels, bulky rings or dangling or hoop earrings. The wearing of jewellery is not permitted during P.E. lessons and discouraged at other times. The wearing of make-up is discouraged.

### PE Kit

**Please ensure that your child has his/her PE kit each week and that all items of kit are clearly marked with your child's name.** Pupils are required to bring dark shorts and a white t-shirt. Please note that football strips are not allowed in school. In addition, for a Games block, training shoes, football boots or gym shoes are required and for blocks of Gymnastics or Dance, bare feet or gym shoes are needed. It is also advised that for blocks of hockey pupils should wear mouth guards and shin guards.

For safety reasons, all pupils with long hair should tie it back and all jewellery should be removed prior to PE activities. It is advised that PE kit is kept in a draw string bag. For the younger children, please ensure that they wear clothes that they can easily manage to take off/put back on PE days.

### PE Teacher Days:

Monday: P.7B, 7H, 3/4, 1	Tuesday: P.5, 5/6, 6, 3, 2, 1/2
Wednesday: P.5/6, 7H, 4, 1/2, 3, 3/4	Thursday: P.6, 7B, 5, 4, 1, 2

PE kit can often be needed on other days, so it should left in school until the end of each term or requires washing. If it is taken home on a weekly basis, it is essential that it is returned on the Monday morning.

### Medication

Please inform us, through the school office, of any relevant medical issues regarding your child of which we are not already aware. In particular it would be helpful to know if your child brings an inhaler to school to self-administer. **Please ensure that you replace any old inhalers or other medication at the start of term.** For any prescribed medication you are required to complete a form available from the school office. **We cannot administer any medication without this form.**

### Punctuality

The majority of children arrive at school on time. It is extremely important that all pupils arrive in the school playground by **8.35am**. There is a line-up bell at 8.39am before coming in at 8.40am. Punctuality avoids disrupting not only the child's learning but that of the whole class. Please note that lateness is recorded and the parents of pupils who are persistently late will be asked into school to discuss the issue. Once all lines are in, the children's entry doors will be locked, so latecomers must enter by the main door and report to the Office.

### Classroom Essentials

Please ensure that your child has all the "tools" that he or she needs to be able to work in school. A well-stocked pencil case is essential and should include: **writing pencils, colouring pencils, eraser, sharpener, ruler and glue stick**. Many items of stationery are available in classrooms, but it would be most helpful if every child brought these basic items on a daily basis.

### Absence

It is very important that you inform the school if your child is going to be absent from school. Please phone the school office between **8.15-8.45am** at the latest indicating the reason and possible length of absence. If you do not inform us, we will telephone / groupcall you to ask about the absence if we do not hear from you by 9.00am. Please send in a note to explain absence when your child returns to school. All pupil absences as well as reasons are monitored and recorded on the information management system.

### Lunch in School

Delicious, freshly prepared school meals are available in school every day. All P.1-3 pupils are entitled to a free meal. The cost for P.4-7 pupils is £2.10 per day, unless entitled to free school meals.

All School meals are now booked and paid (where appropriate) through [www.parentpay.com](http://www.parentpay.com). New families will receive an activation letter and instructions. Meals can be booked for several weeks in advance and can be altered any time up to 8.45am on the day of the lunch. If for any reason you are having any difficulty with either activation or booking lunched please contact the School Office - 01896 830349 or [cliff.balson@scotborders.gov.uk](mailto:cliff.balson@scotborders.gov.uk)

Monday-Thursday: two-course meal with the choice of two traditional dishes, or soup and sandwich option plus a drink of fruit juice, water or milk. Choose main course and dessert.

Friday: a Brunch is offered with tasty hot snacks or sandwiches as well as drinks, fruit and desserts. Choose main course and dessert.

Free meals are available, provided application is made to the Scottish Borders Council and permission is granted. However, all meals must be paid for until the authority accepts the application. Provision is also made in the dining hall area for the eating of packed lunches. We encourage healthy options. No glass bottles or fizzy drink cans should be brought to school.

- P.1-3 children eat at 12.15pm, then go out to play.
- P.4-7 children go out to play at 12.15pm, then come in from around 12.25pm to eat. Toilets and hand washing facilities are available to P.4-7 children between 12.15-12.30pm.

### Safer Routes To School

As part of our Safer Routes to School initiative I would like to remind you of the following:

- Only staff cars will be permitted to enter the school grounds between 8.20am and 9.00am and 2.50pm - 3.30pm.
- When using the car park, parents/visitors **must use designated spaces only**.
- Parking outside the school on the yellow zigzag lines is not permitted and is an offence.
- Please observe the voluntary one-way system where cars should drive down St. Ronan's Road and along Craig Terrace - not up St. Ronan's Road between 8.20-9.00am and 2.50-3.30pm.
- If it is necessary for you to drive your child to school, please park well away from the school and walk the rest of the journey. This is the rule for all parents / carers, including Nursery.
- Please remind your child to stay out of the staff parking area after school hours and to use the designated play areas within the school grounds.

We really appreciate your co-operation with all of these requests which are made in the interests of safety for all concerned.

### Holiday Requests

Taking children out of school during term time is disruptive to your child's education and parents are encouraged to do everything possible to take holidays within the designated school holiday dates. Unless there are exceptional circumstances, time off school for family holidays is recorded by the Council as 'unauthorised family holiday.' If you intend to remove your child from school during term time, you are requested to send in a letter/email to the Headteacher, giving dates of absence. You will receive a standard acknowledgement of this letter.

### Water Bottles

We encourage all our pupils to drink water each day at school. There are water dispensers in school. If your child would like to drink water during the day, they should bring a plastic water bottle, with sports cap if possible, to avoid spilling onto school books. These should be taken home to be cleaned regularly. We also sell water bottles with the school logo and these are available from the School Office at a cost of £1.50.

### Trips and Outings

We arrange trips and outings from time to time. Signed parental permission is required for all trips. Those which are within walking distance of the school are normally covered under the 'local venues' permission slip. Please complete and return this to the school as soon as possible.

## Cycling and Scootering to School Important Notice to Parents



Dear Parents/Carers

While we wish to encourage pupils to cycle or scooter to school, whether alone or accompanied by an adult, the decision as to whether a child is competent to negotiate any hazards they may encounter on the route to and from school must be taken by the parent/carer. St. Ronan's Primary School can accept no liability for any consequences arising from that decision.

The School supports pupils who wish to walk, cycle or scooter to school as it improves health and fitness and reduces traffic outside the school, thus making conditions safer for everyone. Any parent/carer wishing their child to cycle to school must agree to the conditions listed in the Cycle to School contract. This contract must be signed by parents and pupils and returned to school. The School reserves the right to revoke this permission in the event that the contract conditions are ignored.

Parents may wish to take out appropriate insurance cover as the school's insurance does not cover loss of or damage to bicycles. Parents are strongly advised to purchase a good quality bicycle lock and make sure that they have a spare key for this kept at home.

We need to know the numbers of children cycling to school so that we can make appropriate security and safety arrangements.

If you would like your child to cycle or scooter to and from school, please sign and return the Cycle to School contract.

## Cycle to School Policy

### St. Ronan's Primary School



It is ultimately parents' responsibility to ensure that children travel to and from school safely. The school accepts that parents/carers can choose to have their children travel to school by bicycle or another form of transport. In order to promote responsible behaviour and safety conscious cyclists, St. Ronan's Primary School has adopted a "Cycle to School Policy" which requires parents/carers to enter an agreement with the school. We provide an area within the school grounds for secure parking facilities for the bikes belonging to the children who cycle to school and use of these facilities is dependent on parents/carers adopting this agreement.

#### *Parents/carers*

- ◆ Parents will sign the Safe Cycling Contract
- ◆ Parents accept responsibility to keep their child's cycle in good working order, to have it checked regularly and ensure that the bike is of the correct size for their child
- ◆ Parents provide the child with a correctly fitted helmet and something bright to wear while cycling
- ◆ Parents will have the opportunity to be involved in helping with Bikeability training
- ◆ Parents will discuss the safest route from home to school with their child using the map below

#### *Pupils*

- ◆ Cyclists must sign the Safe Cycling Contract
- ◆ Cyclists will wear a correctly fitted helmet and something bright when cycling at all times
- ◆ Pupils will take part in the Bikeability training when offered during school hours
- ◆ Cyclists must ensure that their bike is of the correct size, in good working order and regularly maintained

#### *School*

- ◆ School will provide safe storage for bicycles and scooters
- ◆ School will, with the support of parents, provide Bikeability training
- ◆ School will enforce the policy and contracts for the safety of all



# Cycle to School Contract

- ◆ I will wear a helmet when I cycle to and from school
- ◆ I will wear something bright when I cycle to and from school
- ◆ I will use lights as appropriate
- ◆ I will always try to cycle safely
- ◆ I will consider others when I cycle to school
- ◆ I will maintain my bicycle so it is always in a roadworthy condition
- ◆ I will carry my school equipment in a rucksack on my back or in a cycle bag
- ◆ I will park my bicycle safely and securely at school
- ◆ I will push my bicycle in the school grounds when others are coming to/leaving school
- ◆ I will discuss and agree my safest route to/from school with my parents and always follow it
- ◆ I will cycle to/from school as I was taught in the Bikeability training scheme if applicable
